Larry Reported sending a letter of Support to the Maine DEP and Submerged Lands Marine Debris Grant Programs applying for funding from: the Maine Department of Environmental Protection and Bureau of Submerged Lands in applying for the NOAA-NOS-ORR-2022-2007199 FY22 NOAA Marine Debris Removal Grant under the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA). If received, the monies will remove the vessel (Sans Peur) that sunk in the harbor in 2018, with no cost to the Town. Contact at the State: John Noll

Larry also reported a sailboat on one of the Town moorings, seemingly abandoned: Full of water and listing; owner has been contacted by registered letter and other means. Owner has also been sent an invoice. We are expecting heavy rain, Larry will tow in to the dock and pump it, and contact the Harbormaster Association for treating the boat as abandoned so the Town can remove it.

Discussed at length the purchase of the Pump, location, ordering and installation. With the Coming of the Virginia, and future slip/ dockage the Committee sees the importance of coordinating electrical requirements, in one project.
